BIOGRAPHIES OF PERSONS LIVING IN BRISTOL 1350-1500

These biographies include all Bristol men and women on whom there is dated information between 1350 and 1500. The sources are the copies of wills, Ricart's "Kalendar" of officers as modified by Latimer, Patent Rolls, the Great and Little Red Books of Bristol, the Register of the Trinity Guild of Coventry, William Worcestre's Itinerary, Dallaway's notes on the latter, deeds, Barret's list of M.P.s, some accounts of the Bishop of Worcester's estates, Carus-Wilson's "Medieval Merchant Venturers", the Bristol Tallages of 1327, and the Aulnage Accounts.

The biographies aim to supply brief notes, with sources indicated, for quick reference. The notes by no means claim to be full, but merely provide a number of fundamental facts and dates to help subsequent research.

All the biographies are set out in the same way, only varying in the amount of information. The surname of a particular person may have had an alternative provided in the margin of his or her will. In these cases the alternative appears immediately after the form given by the testator in the first lines of the will, usually bracketed. The source of information for occupations is mainly from

designation in the person's will. Where this is not so, the source is to be found in details given for affairs of the person which are always given after the place of proposed burial. Latimer's list of municipal officers has been adopted rather than the original by Ricart, although he is usually more accurate for fifteenth century offices.

Alternative spellings of surnames appear in brackets before the dates when the person of that name took office. As often father and son had the same Christian names as well as the same interest in municipal affairs, these dates could be attributed to the wrong man in some cases. This is especially so where father and son's careers in office overlap.

The will references are in abbreviated form which is given in full below this introduction. The date of probate of the wills needs some explanation. In the P.C.C. copies the date given is by the ecclesiastical court. No approbation is given for these wills. For the Great Orphan Book wills the date given is that of the probate not the approbation, for this collection of wills was authorised by both the ecclesiastical and the mayoral courts. The probate dates of these are followed therefore by the abbreviations "eccl." or "mayor." to denote which authority granted probate on that date. New style dating is given.

The total for cash legacies is a minimum figure.

Often small money bequests were left to an unspecified number of clergy or relatives. To avoid exaggeration plurals such as these have been counted as two only. So a fourpenny bequest to each chaplain of a certain church would appear as eightpence. Only one will has a bequest of any foreign money, and the number of Flemish pounds is given separately.

The amount of property left in the wills has been categorised into "small", "average", and "large", classes each with a criterion. "A small amount" denotes that the testator left under two tenements and/or five shops.

"An average amount" is two tenements and/or five shops or more, and "a large amount" of real property denotes a minimum of five tenements and/or ten shops. For the exact number and nature of real property bequests see Wadley's extracts, the extracts below, and the tabulated lists of the real property of merchants given above. In the instance of a ship or more usually a share in a ship being left the name is provided, where possible, together with the fraction of the share. Only the more costly items of valuables have been given, including all silver and gold or such specific items like looms or tenters.

The place of burial is not necessarily where the testator

was in fact laid, as the place denoted is only where he wished to be buried. Similarly it cannot be proved that the man named in any information concerning trade, finance, law suits etc., is the same as the testator of the will. Such correlation is only based on probability. Dates of probate, occupations, years in office have all been used in linking such information to a particular person.

Finally, all information excepting that stated otherwise, and the years of office, is taken from the collection of copies of wills. The years of office holding are taken from Ricart's list in conjunction with Latimer's corrections.

A system of cross reference has been adopted throughout these biographies. An asterisk after the name of any person in a biography means he or she has also a biography. This enables family, friends, and trade connections to be easily traced. A small circle after a name denotes that he held office at some time and figures in Ricart's list. There is, however, no other information concerning names marked in this way.

1457. March. Procured another licence for forty quarters of wheat to be carried to Italy with other goods.

The Katherine Sturmy probably sailed sometime later in 1457, and reached the Levant. The Genoese attacked the ship and one of the two other ships sailing with her near Malta.

Reaction in London included the imprisonment of all Genoese in the city and the confiscation of their goods. This began a lawsuit instigated by Philip Mede, then mayor of Bristol. The result of this suit was that the Genoese were condemned to pay the mayor and his brethren nine thousand marks.

1459. July 25th. Sir John Stourton, Philip Mede*, John Eyton,

William Canynges*, Richard Chok and William Coder (*Codir) were commissioned to receive from the Treasurer £6,000 to be distributed to those involved in the venture.
